



Incidents/Accidents on Track

In the event of an accident on track, the following procedure will be followed by Wight Karting staff. If the accident is on track, the sessions will be stopped with a red flag and our shut off technology (De Haardt) will be used. If any injuries have been sustained they will be assessed initially by the track staff, the Duty manager and/or track. If it is safe to do so, we will remove the driver from the track into the clubhouse. Any minor injuries can be treated by the trained first aider on-site. For any more serious injuries an ambulance will be called via 999.

If the accident is in the clubhouse, the procedure will be the same minus the need for stopping of race sessions.

- **The first Aid box is situated in the café area in the clubhouse; as you enter the counter immediately on the left, under the counter.**
- All accidents must be recorded in the accident book by the Duty Manager or Track Supervisor. It requires the details of both the staff member and customer (or Guardian if under 18) and needs to be signed and dated ON THE DAY AT A TIME CLOSELY FOLLOWING THE ACCIDENT.
- Do not administer any First Aid unless you have been trained. Never remove the helmet of a racer who has had an injury on track. Always wait for the emergency services or for the customer themselves to remove the helmet.
- The nearest defibrillator is located at the IOW Adult Community Learning Centre (approx. 100m).
